Mission Projects

Eastern Mennonite Missions (EMM)

CMF is committed to providing support to EMM missionaries serving overseas. We currently support several missionaries and have supported many youth, individuals, and teams who have gone on short-term mission trips or assignments through EMM in the past.

Healthy Ninos Honduras is a partnership between American and Honduran medical professionals, who have a passion to address and eradicate the common health problems brought on by severe poverty, lack of nutrition, poor hygiene, and a lack of quality medical and dental care. At least one mission trip from the States is planned each year to support the local staff and to carry out medical, dental, and cement flooring brigades.

West Africa

CMF is committed to partnering with EMM missionaries serving in Guinea Bissau, West Africa. Community and agricultural development, education, evangelism, church leadership discipleship, and medical ministry are just a few efforts we support.

Heart and Hand Ministries partner with CMF volunteers every summer to build a house for a low-income family in the hills of West Virginia.

Community Meal

Each week, 150-200 members of the Milton and surrounding communities enjoy fellowship and a free hot meal served at the St. Andrew's Methodist Church in Milton.



LOVE, Inc. connects individuals from the Milton community to volunteers from local churches, in order to meet specific practical

needs, such as transportation to and from appointments or outdoor work.

Jubilee Days of Caring provide service and ministry opportunities on a quarterly basis. Projects include serving the community meal, Elijah Bowl Soup Kitchen, Bingo at Milton Towers, friendship-building at Milton Developmental Services, and much more!

My Coins Count - CMF raises money for this program to assist Mennonite Central Committee (MCC) in meeting the physical needs (like food and clean water) for those in developing countries around the world.



The Annual CROP Walk is held in October and raises money through Church World Services to address hunger needs both locally and around

the world. The walk is coordinated through the Milton Ministerium.
